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## 1. THE COMMISSION

Based on the Agreement between the Slovak Republic and the United States of America (198/2005, 303/2017 Z. z. Law register) the J. William Fulbright Commission for Educational Exchange is responsible for administering and supervising the Fulbright Program in the Slovak Republic.

The Commission strives to:

- To support outstanding individuals in both countries who will contribute to extend expertise in their field of specialization;
- To enable leading U.S. and Slovak scholars, students and professionals to be involved in educational and research exchanges, and to develop of relationship and cooperation;
- To increase expertise in fields in which lecturing is provided and/or research is conducted in both countries;
- To extend activities to establish cost sharing programs with participating institutions;
- To serve as an advising center for individuals and institutions on information about study and research possibilities in both countries.

The bi-national **Board of the Directors** oversees the operation of the Commission. Both the Slovak Minister of Education, Science, Research and Sport and the U.S. Ambassador to Slovak Republic appoint the Board members and serve as Honorary Chairmen.

The Board has the responsibility for setting long term goals and priorities of the program, program activities, selection and nomination of grantees, and coordination of finances of the Commission.

## 2. THE FULBRIGHT AWARDS

The Commission administers and supervises a variety of high-profile award programs for U.S. and Slovak citizens based on open and merit-based competition.

The Commission Board takes into account the recommendations of selection committees focusing on professional skills, academic achievements, promising career development, financial means available, and other program requirements; and announces the final nomination of Fulbright grantees.

# Fulbright Scholarship for Graduate Studies

Slovak and U.S. graduate students can apply for up to 9-months fellowships for independent research or study at Slovak or U.S. institutions, respectively. Candidates are required to have an outstanding university record and to submit high-quality, well-conceived projects.

<u>Slovak applicants</u> can conduct independent research; and if funding available to enroll in non-degree or Master's programs. They can apply in all fields except clinical medicine, MBA and LL.M. Candidates without extensive U.S. study experience are given preference.

<u>U.S. applicants</u> can pursue individual research projects under the leadership of a Slovak expert in the respective field. Knowledge of Slovak is required for commensurate with the level needed in fields such as political science, history, linguistics, and anthropology.

# Fulbright Awards for Research and Lecturing

<u>U.S. scholars</u> with comprehensive experience propose projects on research or lecturing at a Slovak host institution. The applications are welcomed in any field; although preference may be given to the needs of Slovak academic institutions. Candidates without extensive research or lecturing experience in SR are given preference.

<u>Slovak scholars</u> who hold a PhD. degree (in arts and some other fields they prove comparable professional experience) include an invitation letter from the U.S. institution in the application. All areas of research or lecturing except clinical medicine are eligible. Candidates without extensive U.S. research or study experience are given preference.

# Fulbright Specialist Program

The program is a short-term complement to the traditional Fulbright Scholar Program. It attracts those U.S. experts who otherwise would not be able to participate in one or two semester program.

Slovak academic institutions can invite a U.S. expert for 2 - 6 weeks to lecture, assist in developing curricula and educational materials, participate or lead seminars or workshops, assist in faculty development, etc. The selection and placement can be handled within 3 months.

## 4. GRANT SUPPORTING ACTIVITIES

The Fulbright year consists of recruitment and selections of candidates for programs administered. It also requires planning of academic cycles, finances, advertising, outreach activities. There is an Emergency Action Plan in place to provide guidance to grantees in variety of situations.

Regular checks and visits have been made to host institutions to check on the professional performance of the grantees and the cooperation with the respective host institutions in both countries.

A/ September 5 -8, 2017, Bratislava: <u>The Orientation Program for incoming U.S.</u> grantees, briefing on the terms and conditions that go with respective awards, on highlights of Slovak history, culture, economy and politics. During the program there was also a reception held to celebrate the amendment of the bilateral agreement and introduction of national visa.

The English teaching assistants took part in a session that focused on methodology and practical issues connected with teaching English at Slovak secondary schools.

B/ The annual <u>Mid-Year Conference</u> for U.S. grantees affiliated in the Slovak and Czech Republics took take place January 31 – February 3, 2018, Trešť, Czech Republic. U.S. Embassy representatives/Board members from Bratislava and Prague joined the grantees.

A session was devoted to discuss cultural sensitivity, diversity and harassment issues reflecting the fact that the group of grantees was diverse and experienced cultural differences.

C/ The <u>Retreat for English Teaching Assistants</u>, June 14 – 17, 2018, in High Tatras. In individual and group discussions the experiences were discussed and based on recommendation the Commission has redesigned supporting materials both for ETAs and the host institutions.



D/ <u>The Pre-Departure Program</u> for the Slovak Fulbright Grantees departing to the U.S. in the AY 2018-2019, was held in Bratislava, June 19, 2018. Its program focused on all aspects of the departure such as terms and conditions of awards, visa, health insurance, financial matters, housing etc. Alumni of the programs and representatives of the U.S. Embassy participated in the event as well.

# 5. ADVISING ACTIVITIES

Part of the Commission's activities is the operation of its Advising Center, that also is a part of the worldwide network EducationUSA, sponsored by the U.S. State Department.

The Fulbright staff works together to provide services for those contemplaiting undergraduate and graduate studies in the U.S. through speaking engagements, participation on fairs, and contact with appropriate staff at schools and universities. Speaking engagements highlight Fulbright grant opportunities and also feature student advising, and vice versa. All opportunities are used to create synergy between grant promotion and advising. Services are being provided free of charge. The trend has been to utilize advising materials and online, together with webinars on variety of topics concerning U.S. higher education.

The Commission cooperates with local InfoUSA Centers, which provide resources on political, economic, cultural, educational and social life in the U.S. These are located in cities of Košice, Bratislava and in Banská Bystrica. The InfoUSA Centers in Košice and in Banská Bystrica are also a part of EducationUSA worldwide network.



In May 2018 **Regional Educational Advising Coordinator** Ms. Gordana Mirchijk visited the Fulbright Commission to discuss strategies in advising, regional cooperation and advisor training.

#### **Outreach Activities:**

#### October

<u>Seminar on Sports Scholarships</u> in the U.S. at University Library Bratislava, in cooperation with the agency TM Sport Agency Bratislava;

<u>VAPAC Study and Career Fair, Bratislava</u>: For the first time the Commission participated in the largest educational fair in the Slovak Republic. During 3 days there were over 8 300 visitors (high school students, high school career advisors, graduate students and parents).

#### November

Annual <u>GOUSA! Educational Fair</u> celebrated the International Education Week. The venue was the University of Constantine the Philosopher in Nitra. Up to 200 high school and university students and faculty from local universities and schools discussed with representatives of Fulbright Commission, U.S. Embassy and various Slovak agencies opportunities for grant fellowships, university studies and work and travel in the U.S.

<u>LLM Fair Vienna</u> - joint project of the Fulbright Commissions in Austria, Czech Republic, Hungary, Slovak Republic, U.S. Embassy Ljubljana and EducationUSA network to promote U.S. law schools and scholarships.

#### December

<u>InfoUSA Centers Representatives</u> Jozef Fabrici, Martina Jesenská, Zuzana Kopčanová and Ľudo Zupko together with the Commission staff were briefed on latest developments and trends in the Slovak educational landscape, information on international trends and developments in HE in U.S. and Europe.

## 6. ALUMNI

Both the U.S. and Slovak alumni remain in close contact with the Commission. They are invited to participate in the evaluation and selection procedures for the various program competitions, and they serve as contacts and hosts for the incoming grantees.

#### A/ Comenius University awarded exceptional faculty and students:

Associate Professor Mária Huttová, Fulbright Fellow 95-96 at University of Pittsburgh, has launched during her time as the Head of the Department of English and American Studies, Faculty of Arts, Comenius University Bratislava,

significant <u>changes in the concept of study programs</u>, and contributed to a major shift in approach of <u>curriculum design of language programs</u> at the whole Faculty;

- Katarina Jurikova, Fulbright Fellow 2015/2016 at Stowers Institute for Molecular Research, launched together with the team of the Department of Genetics, Comenius University Bratislava a project called <u>Genetics on Wheels</u>. The aim of project is to promote genetics and natural sciences to Slovak secondary school students and teachers.
- B/ Pavol Miškovský, Fulbright Fellow 2005-2006 to lowa State, head of the Department of Biophysics and the Center of Interdisciplinary Biosciences at the Faculty of Natural Sciences of P. J. Šafárik University in Košice, he founded SAFTRA Photonics as UPJŠ startup. For its Nanoscreen project, he and his team won the *Main Startup Award for the Best Slovak Startup for 2017.*
- C/ Professor Mikuláš Huba, Fulbright Fellow at College of the Atlantic, Maine, AY 2000-2001, was <u>awarded by the President of the Slovak Republic with the Order of L'udovít Štúr, First Class order</u> to appreciate his outstanding achievements in environmental sciences.
- D/ Professor Milan Kováč, 2014 Fulbright Fellow at Missouri State University and his international research team in the northern Guatemalan jungle -- using new aerial laser scanning -- <u>discovered remains of a Mayan metropolis of 15 million people</u> (and 60,000 buildings, plazas, and pyramids) that collapsed in the 9<sup>th</sup> century.



## 7. ADMINISTRATION, STAFF AND FUNDING

The respective fiscal year of the Fulbright Commission is observed as set by U.S. (October 1 – September 30) and Slovak (January 1 – December 31) regulations. The financial income is composed of two sources of funding: allocation from the Slovak Government and the Government of the U.S.A.

In-kind contributions to the Commission include tuition waivers, funds allocated to other programs through other U.S. or Slovak government activities, health insurance for the grantees, private in-kind sponsorship etc.

Annually the Commission is subject to an independent audit of receipts and disbursements and on the internal control structure. The Slovak Ministry of Education, Science, Research and Sport also audits the expenses from the Slovak government contribution separately.

- A/ Mr. Juraj Brychta quit his job at the Commission and in a 2-round competition process Ms. Zuzana Kopčanová has been selected for the position of Program and Study Officer. She has over 7 years' experience with operating the InfoUSA center in Banská Bystrica and she is also skilled educational advisor and administrator.
- *Annual Executive ED Meeting in Budapest,* April 18 20, 2018, The European Executive Directors meet representatives of the U.S. State Department to discuss budget, safety, security measures and implementation of the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) into the mutual cooperation and exchange of information.
- C/ <u>Fulbright Advocacy Day</u> at the U.S. Congress May 24 25, 2018. The Executive Directors from all over the world together with U.S. Fulbright alumni met with the Republican members of The U.S. House of the Representatives in D.C. discussing the Fulbright Program.

D/ <u>NAFSA Conference</u>, May 29 - June 1, 2018, Philadelphia - meetings with Assistant Secretary of the State Department Ms. Nancy Royce, Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs, Fulbright Foreign Scholarship Board Vice Chair Mr. Mark Pryor, IIE representatives, Fulbright program campus advisors, and presenting Slovak Republic at EducationUSA booth.



E/ Ms. Anna DUNN, Student at University of Wisconsin, Madison, joined the Commission as a <u>Summer Intern</u> in June – August, 2018. She was assisting with developing of information materials for departing Slovak grantees, information brochures for recruiting U.S. scholars and students to apply to Slovak Republic.
